

Addendum to the Diocese of Wichita Catholic Schools Acceptable Use Policy

1-to-1 Student Chromebook Use Agreement

Ownership/Privileges/Consequences

All students at St. Peter Catholic School will be issued a Chromebook to be used in a manner consistent with established instructional and administrative objectives of the school. Chromebooks are the property of St. Peter Catholic School and students have no ownership, interest, or right to title of the device.

Acceptable Use

1. Students are responsible for complying with any and all hardware, software, and service provider licensing agreements, terms of use, and applicable state and federal copyright and other intellectual property protections. Violation of any such licenses, terms, or laws shall constitute a violation of this contract.
2. Students must handle the Chromebook with care, protecting its functionality and appearance.
3. Students may use their assigned Chromebook during the school day.
4. Chromebooks may not be removed from the school building.
5. Students must not use the Chromebook or any applications in any manner other than that for which it is intended.
6. Students must not intentionally modify network configuration files or otherwise interfere with the functioning of the Chromebook.
7. Students must not install software, modify, update, or attempt to repair the Chromebook issued under this contract without the express permission of the school.

- Suspension from school

Protection for Chromebook

- Each middle school student is responsible for providing a neoprene case and a “cinch sack” (drawstring backpack) for their Chromebook.
- Each student is responsible for providing a pair of headphones for their Chromebook.
